Our Town Center

As we head into the summer months there are several project updates I would like to share with you. First, you may have noticed as you drive through our Town Center area that the Town Green entrance (diagonally across Meetinghouse Lane from Town Hall) has seen some recent enhancements. Arden's Garden, a public-private partnership, has now been completed with the addition of four handsome park benches and new plantings to supplement the shrubs and trees that established the garden this past autumn.

These four benches represent the first dedicated benches laid out in the Town Center Beautification Plan. If you'd like to also donate a bench with a dedication plaque, we have identified locations not only in the Town Center but also at our various ball fields, Pease Place Playground, and the Fitzgerald Fitness Tract. Tree Donations for the Center and Fitzgerald Tract


The Beautification Plan also calls for replacing three trees that were removed from the Green. Two replacement trees have been purchased and will soon be planted with memorial plaques. A third location is available for tree donation on the Green and another is available in front of the Library.

Decorative flowering trees will also be planted on Center Road at the Fitzgerald Tract where trees were recently removed during United Illuminating's vegetation management program. New trees have been selected to increase the natural beauty of the area and for their short stature so that they will remain clear of the wires in the future. Notice from the Tax Office

Woodbridge taxpayers are reminded that real estate, motor vehicle and personal property taxes are due July 1, 2019.

Real estate and personal property taxes **over \$100** are due in two installments. The first installment is due July 1, 2019 and becomes delinquent August 2, 2019. The second installment is due January 1, 2020 and becomes delinquent February 4, 2020. Taxes **\$100 or less** and all motor vehicle taxes are due and payable in one single installment on July 1, 2019 and becomes delinquent August 2, 2019. For delinquent payment, interest will be charged on the unpaid installment balance at the rate of 1.5 % per month from the due date. The minimum interest charge is \$2.

The Tax Office is open 8:30 am - 4:30 pm, Monday through

Friday (closed July 4). For your convenience, the office will be open Saturday, July 27, 9 am - noon and Thursday, August 1, 8:30 am - 7 pm. If making payment in person, bring your entire bill so it may be stamped as your receipt. For mail payments, enclose your check, the entire bill and a self-addressed stamped envelope for a return receipt. Credit card payments may now be made online (only) through the Town website at WoodbridgeCT.org. There is a fee charged for this service. Please read the online information carefully.

Failure to receive a bill does not exempt you from payment of tax or penalty, per Conn. Gen. Stat. 12-130, 12-146.

New England Legends with Jeff Belanger



For over 20 years, Jeff Belanger has been exploring the unexplained. He seeks out history, folklore, ghosts, monsters, and legends all over the world and in backyards. her victories and hardships as well as her coming out process, transition process (G-rated), and acceptance process. Learn terms and definitions as well as right and wrong questions to ask other transgender people. Jillian presents her information in an open and honest setting; all are welcome to attend and ask questions. The event is geared to be safe and judgement-free.



In addition to her public speaking work, Jillian is a Gay-Straight Alliance instructor at a New Haven high school, has organized a transgender youth support group and is a member of Stonewall Speakers. She has returned to college to obtain her Master's degree in psychology to become a counselor for primarily trans youth and adults. She is currently interning at the Yale Gender Program in New Haven.






