

## Town Budget & Community Events

Both the Boards of Selectmen and Finance have been working diligently on the next year's budget. A budget represents a Town's priorities and this year our priority is taxpayers. We've directed departments and commissions to be extra mindful of the financial impacts of the pandemic on taxpayers.

A Preliminary Budget Hearing will be held on Monday, April 19, when residents may ask questions or make comments. The Preliminary Budget summary will be mailed to every home in town, and the full preliminary budget will be on the Town website shortly.

Each year as we convene the budget process it becomes clearer to me that we need to grow and diversify our Grand List. Over the past few years, we have consolidated staff positions and reduced programs. We need to focus on growing revenue. This is why I created the 2030 Task Force and charged them with finding ways to create a healthier Grand List by 2030.

Another goal of mine is to create community through events and improving our public spaces. As more residents get vaccinated and as the weather warms up, we are planning to hold more outdoor events.

I am also excited to announce the new "Second Saturdays" series. From May through September the Town will host a free outdoor event on the second Saturday of the month. Events will include a chalk art party, a community tag sale, Friends of the Library book sale, a game day and a craft fair.

In addition to events, we continue to improve our physical assets, especially those outlined in the Woodbridge Town Center Campus Beautification Plan (see the plan on the Board of Selectmen page on the Town website). My goal is



to make the Town Center Campus an inviting public gathering space that encourages residents to linger and interact, creating a stronger sense of community.

Currently the Board of Selectmen is exploring how to accomplish some major goals in the plan, specifically finishing renovations at the Old Firehouse, and creating a beautiful, multi-purpose Community Center, completing renovations at the Senior Center and creating a sidewalk connecting

the high school with the Library. Other projects in the Beautification Plan include seating and signage. The planned bike route – paid for through a campaign with a matching grant – and improvements to the Grove are also part of this vision.

Our buildings will reopen to the public on Monday April 5. Town Hall will be open regular hours; other buildings may differ. We're excited to welcome you back! Masks and social distancing are required, of course. Please see details on the Town website.

Finally, I want to address the two senseless mass shootings in Georgia and Colorado that have saddened us once again. We cannot become inured to these tragedies and allow this to become the acceptable status quo. One or both of these horrific events may have been motivated by hate. The Town of Woodbridge stands with Governor Lamont in condemning "in the strongest of terms – the recent violent acts of racism and hate committed against Asian Americans that we have seen across our country." An attack against anyone based on race, religion, ethnicity, gender, or sexual preference is an attack against our most fundamental values as Americans and an attack against us all. We cannot remain silent.

## Vaccination Assistance

Assistance with COVID-19 vaccine appointments is available through the Human Service Dept. Residents unable to drive or find a ride to their appointment, may call Human Service for assistance.

## Income Tax Assistance

File 2020 taxes virtually with VITA (Volunteer Income Tax Assistance) from your home. VITA offers free tax help to people with disabilities, limited English, low to moderate income and senior citizens. The program is offered through the Human Services Dept. in partnership with the IRS and the CT Association for Human Services (CAHS). A VITA volunteer will schedule a drive-through appointment for document scanning to begin tax preparation.

Clean out your closets this Earth Day – residents are invited to bring many recyclable and reusable items to the Library lawn on Saturday April 24, 9-11 am. Masks will be required.

The Town, in partnership with the South Central Regional Council of Governments, is offering discounted compost bins and rain barrels to residents. Any resident who purchases a compost bin and/or rain barrel may pick it up at the Earth Day event.

Friends of the Woodbridge Library will be accepting donations of children's books, adult books and puzzles. The Friends will only accept clean books without odors or smoke damage. Please limit donations to four boxes per household.

The Recreation Dept. will collect sports equipment and lawn

game donations to be used for summer camp or other programs.

Take 2 Recycling, a certified electronics recycler, will accept electronic items and the Bye Bye Mattress program will accept mattresses and box springs. Goodwill will accept household items.

Residents are also asked to help pick up roadside litter. Trash bags and a list of roads in need of attention will be provided. Public Works will collect the litter bags left roadside the following week.

Woodbridge residents may drop off prescription and over-the-counter drugs to the Drug Take-Back Box located at the Woodbridge Police Dept. Items accepted include pills, ointments or patches, pet medication and vitamins. Not accepted are syringes, thermometers, inhalers, lotions or liquids, aerosol cans, hydrogen peroxide or medications discarded from businesses or clinics.

## Renter's Rebate Program

Applications for the Renter's Rebate Program may be filed with the Town's Assessor between April 1 and Oct. 1, 2021. To be eligible, Woodbridge residents must:

- have turned age 65 on or before Dec. 31, 2020. (Individuals receiving Social Security Disability must be 18 or older and meet requirements below.)
- be full-time Woodbridge residents.

• earn income not greater than \$37,600 for a single person or \$45,800 for a married couple.

Proof of 2020 income and Social Security earnings are required along with copies of receipts or cancelled checks for all rent and utilities (excluding phone and cable) paid in 2020.


