Annual Town Meeting & Improvement Projects

I encourage all residents to attend the Town's Annual Meeting on Monday May 16 at 7:30 pm where residents will have a chance to make comments and ask questions on the Town's annual budget. More details will be on the Town website (www.woodbridgect.org) soon. Additionally, I strongly urge everyone to view the Town's new interactive online budget tool on the Finance Department's page on the Town website.

Our Town's annual budget reflects our shared values, and is a balancing act of our commitments to provide excellent education for our children and show our mutual respect to taxpayers by careful budgeting and responsible spending on Town services.

This year's budget process has been extremely challenging. Our budget issues are caused by a long-term revenue problem. Expenses continue to grow, yet our grand list remains stagnant. These challenges stem from decisions made over many, many years to restrict residential and commercial zoning and to conserve open space, which has left us little room for any growth. Also, this year was the first year in a decade that our grand list grew by more than 1%. New and diverse revenue remains **critical** to continue to fund our high-quality education and other important Town services.

The 2030 Task Force is about to start working with a planning consultant to do placemaking work in our business district. The goal is to make the area more attractive and pedestrian friendly. I'm hopeful these updates can help attract more businesses. Once the Task Force has some ideas, they will hold a community meeting and ask for resident feedback. Our Board of Selectmen Strategic Plan subcommittee (Sheila McCreven and David Vogel) is hard at work outlining the Board's priorities for the future. Financial stability is a major



pillar of that plan. I anticipate sharing a draft plan at the Annual Town Meeting. This plan may also direct some spending priorities for the \$2.6 million in American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funding the Town has received. I would like to see an HVAC system installed in the Center Building gym, which will allow us to safely and comfortably resume holding large community gatherings there. ARPA is a once-in-a-generation funding opportunity, and I strongly believe it should be used for once-in-a-generation, transformational projects.

In addition to adding ventilation, I would like to use ARPA funding to add a pavilion to the Library lawn for outdoor events to have a covered space. We should also upgrade our aging playgrounds and make investments to the aging irrigation systems at our ballfields. It is important that we use this funding to improve ALL residents' quality of life.

Most importantly, we have been focusing on funding quality-of-life improvements without increasing the tax burden. This year I have secured more than \$3 million in State grant funding — \$2 million to renovate the Old Firehouse into a Community Center, \$425,000 for Senior Center renovations and \$600,000 for sidewalks and pedestrian improvements in the Town Center. These improvements, combined with our successful community events, will make our Town Center Campus the beautiful, welcoming, safe and pedestrian-friendly space that our residents want and deserve.

As a reminder, we have two coming community event this month: On May 14 the Community Council is hosting a **Bike Ride** to celebrate the Town's new bike route. We will also hold our always beautiful **Memorial Day Ceremony**, led by veteran Dr. Barry Josephs.

Income & Expense Reports Due for Rental Properties

Rental property owners are reminded that Income and Expense Reports are due to the Assessor's Office by June 1, 2022.

Connecticut General Statute 12-63c requires all owners of rental real property to annually file this report. The information filed and furnished related to the actual rental and operating expenses shall not be a public record and is not subject to the provisions of Section 1-19 (Freedom of Information) of the Connecticut General Statutes.

All properties that are rented or leased, including commercial,

retail, industrial and residential properties, except "such property used for residential purposes, containing not more than six dwelling units and in which the owner resides" must complete this form. If a non-residential property is partially rented and partially owner-occupied this report must be filed.





