Community Projects

As the Summer of 2022 comes to a close, and the beautiful changes of fall begin, there are also many wonderful, significant changes coming to Woodbridge's Town Center Campus. Three major projects will improve the way our municipal center looks, feels and operates. The Center Building Renovation Committee is envisioning how the Center Building can be modernized. Our Community Center Building Committee is working to convert the Old Firehouse into a Community Center, and the Senior Center renovations will begin soon. Our new Sidewalk Project is starting soon as well.

These initiatives are directly related to the Board of Selectmen's Strategic Plan, a goal of which is to "Maintain and Invest in Infrastructure and Facilities." They also support the "Enhance Quality of Life" goal.

Creating community has always been important to me. Investing in our Town Center Campus will create friendly, welcoming places for our residents to interact with each other and build stronger ties to one another and to OUR Town.

The Board of Selectmen set the Senior Center renovation budget, utilizing mostly grant money, and designated Olympus Construction Company as the winning bidder. This project will include a high-quality, air filtration HVAC and many other finishes, with expected completion by late winter or early spring. I am very excited our seniors will finally have a space that is as thoughtful, welcoming and matching the excellent quality of the programming that happens inside!

Creating a Community Center in the Old Firehouse Building with surrounding outdoor spaces has the potential to be transformational for ALL residents. Redesigned spaces will provide multiple venues to gather for events, impromptu get togethers, art and historic exhibitions, performances, fitness, etc. The newly-appointed Community Center Building Committee will oversee this Community & Cultural Center project.



The Center Building project is more long term. I created a Center Building Renovation Committee tasked with planning, designing, constructing and recommending financing (through state and perhaps federal funding) to update the Center Building space for offices, classrooms and programs as well as modernize the police department. The project includes the Gym, Police Department, Human Services offices, and daycare rooms — the Senior Center is currently under renovation. Once the project scope is finalized, we can begin to seek funding which may be a combination of bonding and grants.

The Sidewalk Project will begin soon. Woodbridge received close to \$600,000 in Connecticut State grant funding to complete the Sidewalk Project from the high school to the Town Center. In February 2022 when we knew we were receiving these funds, we were in communication with First Church of Christ officials regarding this project. Sidewalks are necessary for the safety of many residents who walk on Newton Road, as well as Amity High School students who regularly cross Newton Road to access the library, and Town Center. Sidewalks will make the Town Center a pedestrian-friendly place. One crosswalk is included in the project. The Town has been in contact with the State Historic Preservation Office as well.

Finally, the Board of Selectmen is working to make our business district more attractive and welcoming. To accomplish this, the 2030 Task Force is working with a consultant to grow the Town's Grand List. To gather feedback and ideas from residents, property-owners and business-owners, a public information session will take place **Thursday, September 15 at 6 pm at the New England Brewing Company.**

Notice to File Exemptions & Personal Property Declarations

Notice to File Exemptions

Woodbridge residents are reminded to file exemptions by the dates noted below.

- Veterans must file honorable discharge papers (DD-214) by Sept. 30, 2022 with the Town Clerk's office.
- Veterans with a disability rating from the VA must file paper work with the Assessor's Office by Sept. 30, 2022.
- Certificates of Legal Blindness and Social Security Disability Certificates must be filed by Sept. 30, 2022 with the Assessor's Office.
- Farms, Forest and Open Space applications are available in the Assessor's Office and

must be filed between Sept. 1 through Oct. 30, 2022. Please direct questions to the Assessor's Office, 203-389-3416.

Annual Personal Property Declarations Due November 1:

Businesses, professionals and farmers are reminded to complete and return forms to the Assessor's Office by Nov 1. Also, Declaration forms must be filed for owners of:

- non-CT or unregistered motor vehicles
- horses, ponies & thoroughbreds
- mobile manufactured homes not assessed as real estate

Are you a Woodbridge resident? You can now sign up for a library card online! To help celebrate Library Card Sign-Up Month, we've introduced a way for you to register for a Woodbridge Library Card through our website at woodbridgetownlibrary.org. After registering, you will immediately be able to use your new account to place holds on items for pick up at the library.

We will then contact you via email within two business days with your new library card number. At this time, you will get full access to our electronic resources, including downloadable books and magazines.

Please note that this is a temporary registration that will expire in 30 days. Before the 30 days is up, please visit the Woodbridge Town Library in person to verify your name and address. At that time, you will receive a permanent library card.

September is Library Card Sign-up Month, when libraries nationwide join the American Library Association (ALA) to remind parents, caregivers, and students that signing up for a

library card is the first step on the path to academic achievement and lifelong learning.

Libraries play a crucial role in the education and development of children, offering a variety of programs to spark creativity and stimulate an interest in reading and learning.
