

Budget & Community Projects

March is National Disabilities Awareness month. It is a great opportunity to remind residents that our website at woodbridgect.org aims to be user friendly with assistive technology and compatibility with many screen readers. This past month the Board of Selectmen made its operating budget recommendations to the Board of Finance. Budget meetings may be watched live on Channel 79, and via the WGATV79 YouTube link—please see the homepage of the Town's website.

The best way for residents to share their thoughts on Town finances is at the **Monday, April 24 Preliminary Budget Hearing** when the Board of Finance presents its proposed spending plan. This meeting will take place at 7:30 pm at the Amity High School Auditorium. Following this hearing the Board of Finance may make changes to its proposed budget which will then be presented at the Annual Town Meeting on May 15 at Amity High School Auditorium at 7:30 pm.

I'm pleased to share with you that a 55+ housing proposal has been approved by the Town Plan and Zoning Commission and reviewed by Inland Wetlands. The project, located at Litchfield Turnpike and Bradley Road, will move forward with construction set to begin this month. The design features attached townhouses with 2-3 bedrooms set on private roads with a community center and pool on the premises. Toll Brothers estimates construction will be completed in 3 years. This will grow our Grand List while not adding to the enrollment in our schools!

The Ad Hoc 2030 Task Force continues to work on taking a big picture look at the changes the town should consider to diversify and broaden our Grand List. The bipartisan Task



Force, with co-chairs Chris Dickerson and Susan Jacobs, is concentrating on connectivity in the business district to maximize potential grant dollars to offset expenditures. The Board of Selectmen is moving ahead, unanimously accepting the Ad Hoc Committee's recommendations, authorizing our Administrative Officer/Director of Finance Tony Genovese to seek State and Federal grants. Grants may be available through President Biden's bipartisan Build Back Better Infrastructure Law.

I believe the Beecher Road School pool is an asset to our community. It provides a vast range of programs for development of community swimmers - a vital life skill for our children - including the learn to swim programming through the school and lessons through the Recreation Department. These programs also act as a feeder system for the Amity High School Swim Team and the Woodbridge Aquatic Club. The pool provides a recreational outlet and opportunity for the continued health and well-being for all community members. The Board of Selectmen and Board of Finance have unanimously approved the request for replacement of pool filters and associated equipment as well as the transfer of current Recreation Department funds to cover this cost.

At its February meeting, the Board of Selectmen approved the updated Strategic Plan document as presented by Selectmen McCreven and Vogel. This plan has identified priorities among the most important and pressing issues facing the Town of Woodbridge. You may view the plan in its entirety at the Town's website.

Spring Bulk Pickup

Call the Department of Public Works at 203-389-3420 to schedule an appointment for spring bulk pickup. There is a \$50 fee per appointment to be paid upfront prior to pickup.

Spring bulk pickup will take place by appointment only each Tuesday in March through May between 7:30 am and 3:30 pm. Bulk pickup will be offered again during the months of October and November. Residents are asked to limit use of this service to one time per year to allow everyone to take advantage of this program.

A list of items to be placed curbside will need to be provided when scheduling an appointment. Items should be large household items that cannot fit in a car trunk such as large furniture, washing machines, dryers, gas grills, lawn mowers, carpeting, bed frames, and the like. The disposal fee for freon based appliances (air conditioners, refrigerators, dehumidifiers) is included in the \$50 pickup charge.

The Woodbridge Police Department is pleased to announce two new safety programs: Alzheimer's Alert Program and Autism Safety Alert Program. Individuals may be registered to either program by family members and caregivers. While program registration is voluntary, participation will enable police officers to access important information in the event of an emergency.

Alzheimer's Alert Program

When a family member or friend who has been afflicted with Alzheimer's Disease wanders, it can be devastating. The Woodbridge Police Department would like to help. If a family member/friend is missing, immediately contact the Woodbridge Police Department. Please provide Dispatch personnel with a detailed description of the missing person. In addition, make Dispatch personnel aware if your loved one is registered in the Alzheimer's Alert Program. Registration is **voluntary**. Information provided will be kept confidentially on file in the Dispatch Center of the Police Department.

Autism Safety Alert Program

This program will provide police officers with relevant information, prior to responding to an incident involving a person with Autism Spectrum Disorder. Families who would like to participate in this program are asked to voluntarily provide the Woodbridge Police Department with pertinent information relating on how to appropriately communicate/interact with their loved ones. Our goal is to bring each engagement to a successful conclusion. Program registration is **voluntary**. The program is designed for Woodbridge residents, students who attend school in Woodbridge, and individuals who work in town. Information provided will be kept confidentially on file in our Dispatch Center.

Forms for both the Alzheimer's Alert Program and the Autism Safety Alert Program are available to the public at the Woodbridge Police Department, Woodbridge Human Services, and the Woodbridge Senior Center.


