The Woodbridge Police Department is pleased to announce two new programs.

Alzheimer's Alert Program - When a family member or friend that has been afflicted with Alzheimer's Disease wanders, it can be devastating. The Woodbridge Police Department would like to help the families/friends of those with Alzheimer's Disease. If a family member/friend is reported missing, please immediately contact the Woodbridge Police Department. Please provide Dispatch personnel with a detailed description of the missing person. In addition, advise Dispatch personnel that your loved one is registered in the Alzheimer's Alert Program. Registration is VOLUNTARY. Information provided will be kept confidentially on file in our Dispatch Center.

Autism Safety Alert Program - The purpose of the program is to provide officers with relevant information, prior to responding to an incident involving a person with Autism Spectrum Disorder. Individuals who would like to participate in this program are asked to voluntarily provide the Woodbridge Police Department with pertinent information relating on how to appropriately communicate/interact with their loved ones. Our goal is to bring each engagement to a successful conclusion. Registration for the program is VOLUNTARY. The program is designed for Woodbridge residents, students that attend school in Woodbridge, and individuals that work in town. Information provided will be kept confidentially on file in our Dispatch Center.

Forms for both the Alzheimer's Alert Program and the Autism Safety Alert Program are available to the public at the Woodbridge Police Department, Woodbridge Human Services, and the Woodbridge Senior Center.
