Budget Set & The Center's Grand Re-opening

Now that the calendar page has flipped to June, the month of the year with the most daylight hours, I wish all those who celebrate, a happy Father's Day. I hope you will all join me in enjoying the beauty of Woodbridge at this time of year.

At the Annual Town Meeting on May 15, Town officials answered residents' questions and listened to their comments. Following resident feedback, the Board of Finance adopted the presented FY24 Budget and set the Mill Rate. Thank you to all the residents who came to the meeting. For those who could not attend, please see the May 26 edition of the Woodbridge Town News for an abridged copy of my State of the Town address.

At each Annual Town Meeting, we celebrate the completion of another budget preparation cycle after literally thousands of hours of work done by Town staff and members of the community who volunteer their time on Boards and Commissions. I offer my sincere thanks to everyone, especially the award-winning Finance Department, directed by Administrative Officer and Finance Director Tony Genovese.

This will be the final edition of the Woodbridge News and Events newsletter. Unfortunately, the production costs of the publication, along with postage, exceed advertising revenue. Please know that you may access Town specific news in the Woodbridge Town News newspaper, which is sent to every home, as well as the Town's website and calendar at woodbridgect.org, the Town's Facebook page, and department-specific Facebook pages. Residents are also welcome to contact this office with questions.

At the Board of Selectmen meeting in May, we reestablished the Ad Hoc Sustainability Committee, with co-chairs Hillary Drumm and Tom Kenefick. I hope you will remember that previously when we attained the Bronze Level Certification in October of 2018 it allowed for access to grant dollars. With renewed interest in certification, we will have potential for both state and federal grant dollars to come to



Woodbridge as well as Community Matching Funds. Together with committee members I will set a draft charge for this group. The Committee will conduct a review of current data and formulate recommendations to the Board of Selectmen for consideration on sustainability initiatives. Topics under review may include town building energy use, recycling, waste, food systems, vehicles and transportation, as well as education and outreach to the community regarding these topics.

The Board of Selectmen unanimously endorsed the concepts presented by the Ad Hoc 2030 Task Force and authorized the Task Force to share its preliminary vision to a selection of Town Boards and Commissions and seek their support over the next few months.

We are all so excited that the long-awaited renovation of The Woodbridge Center is finally coming to completion, and we can celebrate the grand re-opening with the community. When finished, the Senior Center will be a modern, fresh, welcoming, air-conditioned space with excellent ventilation. This project is the result of years of planning, and, with State and Federal funding, will help those over 55 remain healthy and active through new and continuing health and wellness programming. This project could not have come to fruition without the steadfast help of the Town's legislative delegation: Senators Maroney and Cabrera and Representative Welander. Another item for your calendars is a ceremony planned by the Governor's Office to honor Vietnam Veterans. This event will be held in Woodbridge on July 17 and will feature special citations to all residents who are Vietnam Veterans. The event will be held at 5 pm at The Woodbridge Center.

Important Reminders for Pet Owners

June is Dog License Month in Connecticut. Reminders will be mailed to Woodbridge dog license holders.

Fees remain at \$8 for spayed or neutered dogs and \$19 for dogs that are not spayed or neutered. Please remit payment to the Town Clerk's office via the stamped, return envelope included in the mailing. Remember to include the copy of the dog license notice and rabies certificate (if necessary).

The dog license, tag and clip will be mailed once payment is

received. Licenses are valid for one year, from July 1, 2023 through June 30, 2024. There will be a \$1 late fee per month for licenses requested after July 1.

Please be reminded that dogs must be leashed at all times when in a public area. This town ordinance is in place for the safety of everyone in our community.

All persons liable to pay real estate, motor vehicle or personal property taxes in the Town of Woodbridge are hereby notified that the Tax Collector has received the warrant levied by the Board of Finance to collect taxes on the Grand List of October 1, 2022, which become due and payable on July 1, 2023.

Real estate and personal property taxes over one hundred dollars (\$100) are due in two installments. The first one-half shall be due on July 1, 2023 and become delinquent on August 2, 2023. The second one-half shall be due on January 1, 2024 and delinquent on February 2, 2024. Any tax in the amount of one hundred dollars (\$100) or less and all taxes on motor vehicles shall be due and payable in one single installment on July 1, 2023 and become delinquent on August 2, 2023. If the installment payment due becomes delinquent, interest will be charged on the installment payment at the rate of 1.5% per month from the due date. Minimum interest charge is \$2.

The Tax Office will be open Monday through Friday from 8:30 am till 4:30 pm. The Town Hall will be closed on July 4, 2023. For your convenience we will be open on Saturday, July 29 from 9 am to 12 pm and on Tuesday, August 1, the last day to pay without penalty, from 8:30 am till 7 pm. If you wish to pay in person, you must bring your entire bill with you so we may stamp your receipt. All mailed bills must be postmarked by the United States Postal Service prior to the delinquent date to be considered on time. You must enclose your check, the entire bill and a self-addressed stamped envelope for a return receipt. Credit card payments may be made online (only) at woodbridgect.org. There is a fee charged for this service, please read all information carefully.

Failure to receive a bill does not exempt you from payment of tax or penalty, per Conn. Gen. Stat. 12-130, 12-146.

Hurricane Safety Tips

The Woodbridge Police Dept. warns that the Atlantic hurricane season runs June to November with peak season in mid-August to October. Hurricanes can cause catastrophic damage to shorelines and several hundred miles inland. High winds, torrential rains, and flash flooding can persist for days.

A Hurricane Watch means a storm may be possible within 36 hours, and a Hurricane Warning generally indicates a storm within 24 hours. Below are safety tips for residents.

- Secure outdoor property and clear clogged gutters and downspouts.
- Charge cell phones and personal computers.
- Have available ample food and water, flashlight batteries, and water for sanitary purposes and flushing toilets.
- Remain indoors, away from glass doors and windows.
- Drive only when necessary avoiding flooded areas.
- Keep away and report loose or dangling power lines to 203-387-2511.
- Contact authorities to report police, fire or medical emergencies.
- Listen to the radio or television for updates, and receive storm alerts from the United Illuminating Co. via prerecorded calls, emails and text messages. **Register at uinett.com to receive storm alerts and updates, and report power outages. Call 911 for downed wires.**
