Attending meetings, managing budgets, and speaking at local events are among the many official responsibilities that come with being your First Selectman.


One of the roles I consider to be most important is making myself available to hear concerns from residents and work with other Town officials on potential solutions.

I strive for residents to enjoy a high quality of life here in Woodbridge—one that reflects the commitment we all make each day to keep our community special.

Whether it is Board and Commission members donating their time to help guide our Town, or residents reaching out to let us know when something is not right, we all can make our community better by stepping up or speaking up.

For example, we have heard from several residents about various roads in Woodbridge that need repair and repaving. Budget constraints in recent years meant less funding to complete this work, and your input led our Board of Selectmen to leverage grant funds to increase the amount we allocated for this purpose in our latest budget.

As a result, we will have repaved and patched more of Woodbridge roads this year than in many recent years. These freshly repaved and replenished streets leading up to our homes directly increase our quality of life here in Town.



Smooth roads can often make it easier for drivers to forget to check their speed, and I have heard concerns from community residents about speeding in various residential areas. People care because this issue directly affects their safety and that of their families, as well as our quality of life.

We can all agree that children outside playing and riding bikes, neighbors going for walks or walking their dogs, and homeowners checking for mail should feel just as secure on our streets as those behind the wheel.

At Town Hall, we are working closely with our Police Department to increase traffic monitoring and explore additional measures, such as enhanced technology and signage, to ensure that speed limits are respected throughout our community.

As a nearby town leader recently said, "Drive Local". You can do your part by keeping track of your speed and remembering that nothing is more time-sensitive than helping to keep fellow members of our community safe.

The other thing you can do regularly is keep your comments coming. The only way that Town staff, volunteer leaders, and I will know your concerns—as well as your ideas for improving our community—is if you let us know. For Woodbridge to be the best it can be, we need to hear from you so we can continue working together.

Voting Options for the Presidential Election



The right to vote is one of our most fundamental liberties and one of our most important duties as citizens. For the 2024 Presidential Election, several options for voting are available.

Woodbridge residents may conveniently vote in person before Election Day. **Early voting will take place from Monday, October 21 through Sunday, November 3 in the Town Hall Meeting Room** located at 11 Meetinghouse Lane. Polls will be open from 10 am - 6 pm each day including weekends with extended hours from 8 am - 8 pm on Tuesday, October 29 and Thursday, October 31. Same Day Registration will be available during this period.

Anyone turning 18 years old by November 5 and who is a US Citizen is eligible to register and vote. For online Voter Registration and Absentee Voting information, go to the [Registrars Page](#) on the Town website.

To help with any questions, a Registration Session will take place in the Office of the Registrars located in Town Hall on Friday, October 18 from 9 am - 8 pm.

For Election Day, November 5, polls will be open for in person voting from 6 am - 8 pm in the Center Building gymnasium located at 4 Meetinghouse Lane. Same Day Registration will be available.

POCD Open House October 8 from 4-7 pm

On October 8, the first public Open House will be held to discuss the 2025 Plan of Conservation and Development (POCD). Everyone from the Woodbridge community is invited and encouraged to attend this “drop in” style meeting—stop by Town Hall anytime between 4-7 pm.

The Open House will be an opportunity to learn about the POCD process, review community data and survey results, and most importantly share ideas. Several workshop stations focusing on a variety of community topics will be set up to gather feedback.

The 2025 POCD will identify our community’s visions, goals,

objectives and action steps for the next ten years. For this reason, it is important to hear from Woodbridge residents, property owners and businesses during the initial stages of updating the POCD.

Notice to File Annual Personal Property Declarations

The Woodbridge Assessor reminds personal property owners to file an annual Personal Property Declaration Form on or before Friday, November 1, 2024.

Declaration Forms must be filed by all businesses, professionals, and farmers as well as owners of:

- non-CT or unregistered motor vehicles
- horses, ponies & thoroughbreds

• mobile manufactured homes not assessed as real estate.

Declarations Forms must be completed and received in the Assessor’s Office no later than November 1, 2024. Forms that are received late or that are not filed will be subject to a 25% penalty.
