MONTHLY INCIDENTS of SPECIAL INTEREST: January 2025

- **Larcenies/ Attempted Larcenies from Motor Vehicles:**

Occurred during the overnight hours, a vehicle parked in a residential driveway located on RT 67, and during the daytime hours from vehicles parked in business establishment parking lots located on Bradley Road and on RT 69.

- **Stolen Motor Vehicles:**

Occurred during the early morning hours from a business establishment parking lot located on Amity Road.

A stolen vehicle from a neighboring community was found abandoned on RT 69.

Please remember to lock your vehicles, secure the keys/fobs and to remove or conceal any valuables, including remote controlled garage door openers.

- **Thefts from Mailboxes:**

Recently, there has been a rash of mail thefts in our area. Thieves are stealing business and personal checks from the mailboxes of residents, as well as from standalone USPS mailboxes. The stolen checks are then fraudulently altered and cashed for large sums of money. The Woodbridge Police Department is working in collaboration with the United States Postal Inspector's Office to investigate and combat these offenses and reminds you to take the following precautions: ② Do not leave outgoing mail (with red flag raised), in your mailbox. This invites thieves to steal your mail. ② Mail your business and personal checks inside of a Post Office. ② When you receive mail, retrieve it as soon as possible. ② When writing a check, use ink. Fill out the sections of the check completely. ② Frequently monitor your banking activity to detect any fraudulent transactions. If any are detected, immediately report them to your financial institution. ② Report any suspicious activity, suspicious person or suspicious motor vehicle.
