

Center Building Update

I am pleased to inform you that, following a comprehensive review and consultation with a range of environmental and health specialists, we have confirmed that there is no asbestos-related air quality issue at the Center Building. We consulted experts from multiple respected agencies, including the Connecticut Department of Health, Quinnipiac Valley Health Department, OSHA, Fuss & O'Neill Hazardous Building Materials Consultants, as well as Yale's Occupational and Environmental Health specialists. All these experts have concluded that the Center Building can be safely reopened and occupied.

To further ensure the safety and peace of mind of our staff and the public, the Town will be taking additional steps to address the situation. We have hired a licensed company to perform cleaning in the specific areas where traces of asbestos were identified. This cleaning will target identified zones and is expected to be completed by the end of March. Furthermore, we are in the process of preparing a formal survey and plan to identify all asbestos areas of the building that we can and determine whether any areas require further attention or remediation.

We understand that this issue has caused some concern, and we would like to express our gratitude to both our dedicated staff and our residents for their patience and understanding as we navigated this process. Your support has been invaluable as we have worked diligently to ensure that the building is



safe and ready for occupancy.

As a result of these efforts, we anticipate that the gym, the Woodbridge Center Café, and kitchen areas will be thoroughly cleaned and reopened for use at the end of March. Other areas of the building will follow based on planning and funding under consideration. We are committed to keeping you informed every step of the way and will continue to take all necessary measures to ensure the safety and well-being of everyone in our community.

Thank you once again for your continued patience and trust as we work to resolve this matter.

On another topic, **the second 2025 Plan of Conservation & Development (POCD) Drop-in Open House will take place Tuesday, April 8 in the Town Hall Conference Room—stop by anytime between 4-7 pm.** As you may know from past communications, the 2025 POCD is in the process of being developed. The plan will identify our community's visions, goals, objectives and action steps for the next ten years. This Open House will focus on theme areas, goals, strategies and action items. Woodbridge residents, businesses, and interested parties will have the opportunity to review information, offer comments and share ideas. The Preliminary Budget Hearing is designed so that residents may ask questions or make comments about the proposed budget ahead of the Annual Town Meeting. Following this hearing, the Board of Finance may make changes to the proposed budget which then will be presented at the Annual Town Meeting set to take place in the Center Building gym on Monday, May 19 at 7:30 pm.

Renter's Rebate Program

Applications for the Renter's Rebate Program may be filed with the Town's Assessor between April 1 and Sept. 30, 2025. To be eligible, Woodbridge residents must:

- have turned age 65 on or before Dec. 31, 2024. (Individuals receiving Social Security Disability must be 18 or older and meet requirements below.)
- be full-time Woodbridge residents.

• earn income not greater than \$45,200 for a single person or \$55,100 for a married couple.

Proof of 2024 income and Social Security earnings are required along with copies of receipts or cancelled checks for all rent and utilities (excluding phone and cable) paid in 2024.
