Completed Projects Bring Inviting Changes

You'll also spot the finishing touches on the old Firehouse renovation—soon to open as our new Woodbridge Community Center. What was once an underused facility will now become a welcoming space for all residents to gather, host events, and build connections.

This grant funded project is a unique initiative that brings the stories of our historic district to life. Election Day is November 4



Election Day is Tuesday, November 4. Polls for the Woodbridge Municipal Election will be open from 6 am to 8 pm in the Center Building gymnasium at 4 Meetinghouse Lane.

Same Day Registration will be available in The Center café, also located at 4 Meetinghouse Lane, so residents may conveniently register and vote. To register, proof of identity and proof of Woodbridge residency will be needed. A CT issued Driver's License, Learner's Permit, or State ID with a Woodbridge address will serve to establish both.

Absentee Ballots, Early Voting Ballots, and Same Day Registration Ballots will be centrally counted in The Center café between 8 am and 6 pm on Election Day. All Absentee Ballots must be returned by 8 pm on Election Day to be counted.

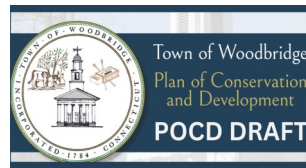

Reminder! Non-Profit and Tax-Exempt Organizations must file 2025 Quadrennial Tax-Exempt Forms with the Assessor's Office by Monday, November 3, based on CT State Statute. **Forms must be filed by this deadline to ensure Tax-Exempt Status remains intact for organizations.**

Woodlawn Duckpin Bowling Trip

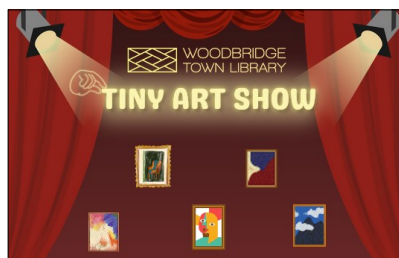

Library News

This November the library is offering potentially life saving training. According to the CDC, suicide is one of the leading causes of death in the United States, and rates are rising among teens and adults under 35. To help combat this crisis, the Woodbridge Town Library has partnered with the Quinnipiac Valley Health District to offer QPR suicide prevention training on Friday, November 21 from 3 pm to 4:30 pm.

QPR stands for Question, Persuade, and Refer — the three simple steps anyone can learn to help save a life from suicide. Just as people trained in CPR and the Heimlich Maneuver help save thousands of lives each year, people



trained in QPR learn how to recognize the warning signs of a suicide crisis and how to question, persuade, and refer someone to help. Seating is limited so registration is required. Sign up on our website or call our Adult Services Dept.
