## Coming Together for Woodbridge

The past few months have brought big discussions about housing, our values, and the kind of future we want for our Town.

To help us move forward, I am launching a new initiative: "Conversations with the First Selectman." **Please join me in the Library Meeting**

**Room from 6:30-8:00 pm on Tuesday, February 24th for the first of these conversations.**

These informal gatherings will provide residents with the opportunity to ask questions, share ideas, and speak directly with Town leadership about what's happening in Woodbridge and why.

The goal is to ensure our community controls the future of Woodbridge. Thoughtful decisions that reflect our shared values are critical at this juncture. It is important that we come together to understand each other, and the situation.



For our part, we will be able to share with you what we have been learning from planners, small developers, and policy experts who are helping us to move from "What should we do?" to "Here's how we get what we want done."

I urge you to join in on the conversation. As we plan these sessions, we will post announcements on our Community Calendar, the First Selectman's Page of our website, and in my eNewsletter.

On another note, one of the most important tools we have for shaping the future of our community is our annual budget. From education to public safety, recreation to infrastructure, it reflects our shared priorities and values. Residents will have the opportunity to ask questions and offer input on the budget at the Preliminary Budget Hearing in April.

Department budget presentations wrap up on January 29, and I encourage all residents to stay informed by watching those meetings, and others, on the Town's WGATV79 YouTube channel.

## Tax Relief Programs Expanded

Woodbridge residents may begin to file applications for **State and Town Elderly and Totally Disabled Tax Relief Programs**. Proof of 2025 income and Social Security earnings are required. **Applications must be filed with the Town Assessor by May 15, 2026.**

Eligible residents include individuals who:

1. turned age 65 on or before December 31, 2025; individuals on Social Security Disability are exempt from age requirement.
2. hold full time residence in Woodbridge.
3. meet the State program income limits of \$46,300 maximum for singles and \$56,500 maximum for married couples.
4. meet the Town program income limits (for single or married) of \$72,448 maximum to qualify for a \$1,600 Tier 1 credit and \$108,672 maximum for a \$1,320 Tier 2 credit.

**Veterans Tax Relief** is available through a local veteran exemption offered by the Town. There is no age requirement. **Applications must be filed with the Town Assessor by October 1, 2026.**

To qualify, honorable discharge papers (DD-214) must have been filed with the Town Clerk's office by September 30, 2025. The maximum income for this program is \$71,300 for a single person or \$81,500 for a married couple.

Applications for all programs will be mailed to residents who are presently on a program and need to refile.

All applications may be filed with the Assessor's Office at Town Hall from Mon. through Fri, 8:30 am to 4:30 pm.

On the dates below, the Woodbridge Board of Assessment Appeals will meet to hear appeals relating to assessments for Real Property and Personal Property on the October 1, 2025 Grand List:

- Wed., March 11, 6-9 pm
- Thu., March 12, 6-9 pm
- Mon., March 16, 6-9 pm

Dates and times are subject to change based upon the number of appeal applications received.

Written applications are mandatory for an appeal to be heard. [Applications](#) and [Application Instructions](#) are on the Board of Assessment Appeals page on the Town website, [woodbridgect.org](http://woodbridgect.org). Completed applications must be returned to the Assessor's Office **no later than 4:30 pm on February 20, 2026.**

Individuals filing proper applications shall be notified by March 1

of the day, time, and information relating to their appeal hearing.

The applicant or a duly preauthorized representative must appear. (Written authorization and the representative's personal identification must be provided to the Assessor's Office prior to the hearing date.)

If appealing the assessed value of your property, documents must be included with your application as evidence to support your claim or an appraiser's analysis of your property value based on the October 1, 2024 revaluation year comparable sales. Comparable sales are those of similar style, size, and location and must be from the year ending October 1, 2024.

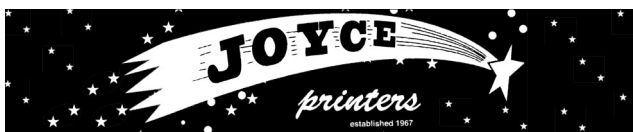
